Administrators: Hours are approved by the North Dakota Board of Examiners for Nursing Home Administrators. Maximum number of contact hours is 15.75.

Nursing: Nursing contact hours for this conference were approved by the North Dakota Board of Nursing (NDBON), Approval #1958. Total possible contact hours for attendance at all standard nursing sessions: 15.25. The NDBON does not endorse or recommend any specific commercial product, company or services represented at the conference. Certificate must be retained by licensee for 2 licensure renewal cycles (4 years). Training that has been approved by the ND Board of Examiners for Nursing Home Administrators, a ND Board of Nursing recognized provider of continuing education (CE), may be used to meet CE requirements for ND nurse licensure renewal.
