Nursing Centers are now judged by a new re-structured survey process designed to focus on the patient and care outcomes. Bringing together the two current survey processes, the new system provides much structure for decision making and compliance determination. Defending you staff and care delivery has become more complicated and difficult. Integrating the revised Requirements of Participation into your current practice while preparing for a new survey approach is a giant undertaking. Understanding your patients, data and outcomes is critical.


